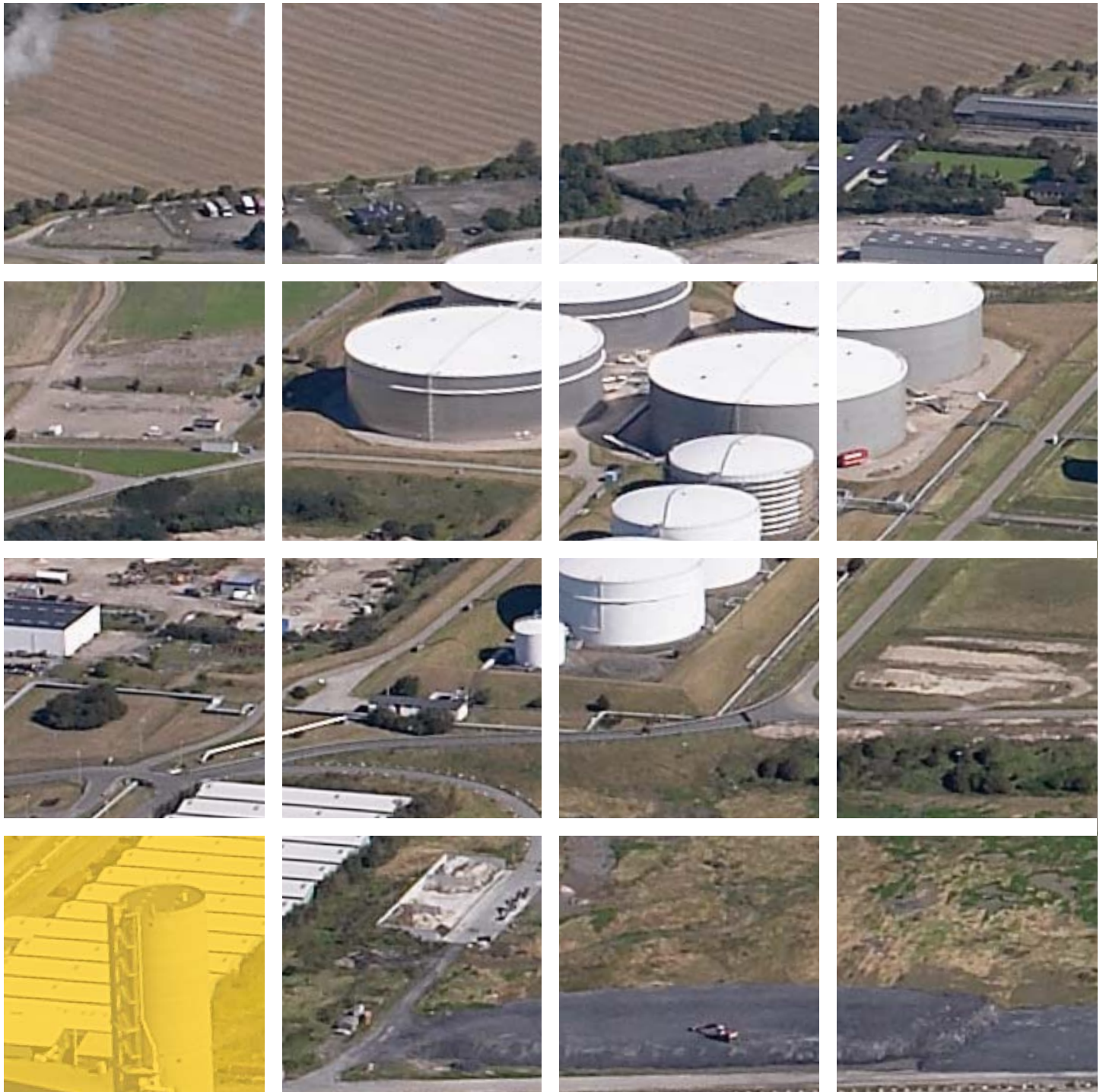


# Stigsnaes, Denmark

Located in the Danish Straits, Stigsnaes Oil Terminal (SOT) is ideally located to service the growing traffic from Russia, the Baltic Rim and western Europe.





The terminal's seven mild steel tanks have a combined storage capacity of 406,000m<sup>3</sup> and are temperature controlled for the safe storage of fuel oil and vacuum gas oil (VGO).

#### History and development

With historically high utilisation rates, SOT provides first class facilities for storing and blending oil products for some of the world's leading oil companies and traders.

#### Technical skills

Specialist infrastructure and services at SOT include tank capacities of 22,000m<sup>3</sup> and 85,000m<sup>3</sup> and pipeline connections to a single berth deep water jetty. In addition, the terminal offers high loading rates up to 2,500 cbm/hour together with tank-to-tank and in-tank blending to order. It can accommodate large oil tankers, including Aframax and Suezmax, as well as VLCC class tankers.
